



ATTENTION: Indoor gatherings are not currently permitted under the San Francisco County Public Health Order. For this reason, all churches in San Francisco have been asked to suspend public Masses indoors. Until further notice, all scheduled weekday and weekend masses at Church of the Visitation will be closed to the public. We will be returning to the livestream schedule that was in place at the start of the pandemic (see below). Only those people necessary to serve the Mass and livestream it will be allowed to attend (no more than 12). Obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains under Dispensation until restrictions and limitations are lifted. But you must keep the Lord's Day holy in other ways, at home. "STORM HEAVEN WITH PRAYERS"

In his most recent update to priests on the status of church reopenings, Archbishop Cordileone asked them to help their parishioners engage in focused prayer and penance as we endure all of the difficult conditions that Coronavirus has caused:

"...it is my conviction that, with all that is going on in our society at this time, we need to redouble our efforts on the spiritual level. In particular, in addition to adoration, we have to reclaim an authentic and serious spirit of fasting. Fasting has traditionally been understood to mean no more than one meal in the course of a day. I am asking you to join me in observing Friday as a day of fast (unless your health condition cannot allow for it): please abstain from at least one meal on Fridays, and more than one if possible. Let us storm heaven with prayer and fasting for a restoration of public worship unhindered, for a swift end to this pandemic, for health care workers and researchers, and for government officials who must make very complicated decisions for the overall well-being of our communities."

AWE AND PRAISE

In today's passage from Romans, Paul concludes his complex reflections on the Jewish people, the emerging Gentile churches, and God's work among them. Paul has struggled to understand the responses of both the Jewish and Gentile communities, with their mix of acceptance and rejection of Jesus. He warns the Roman church to avoid any sense of superiority over Jews or non-Christian Gentiles, for everyone is in need of God's mercy. Paul acknowledges the limits of his understanding, and gives way to prayers of awe and praise. He concludes by marveling at the limitless mercy of God, whose designs are ultimately mysterious.

Sometimes our own prayer can be like that of Paul. In conversation with God, we try to make sense of life, especially its difficulties. The full truth of what's going on in our lives or in our world eludes us, and so we work humbly with the truth that we can understand. If we believe our mysterious God is indeed trustworthy, we can open our hearts in praise, and allow God to shape our lives.

FILM OF THE FATIMA STORY

The long-awaited film, *Fatima*, is scheduled to be released in select theaters and digitally through Premium Video on demand on **August 28th** by Picturehouse. The film was originally scheduled to release on April 24th, but was postponed due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The film tells the story of a 10-year-old shepherd, Lúcia dos Santos, and her two young cousins, Francisco and Jacinta Marto, who reported seeing visions of the Blessed Virgin Mary in Fátima, Portugal, circa 1917. Their revelations inspire believers but anger officials of both the Catholic Church and the secular government, who try to force them to recant their story. As word of their prophecy spreads, tens of thousands of religious pilgrims flock to the site to witness what became known as the Miracle of the Sun. The film is directed by Marco Pontecorvo, with an international cast, including Stephanie Gil, Lucia Moniz, Harvey Keitel, and Sonia Braga; and the original song “Gratia Plena” by Paolo Buonvino is performed by tenor Andrea Bocelli.
