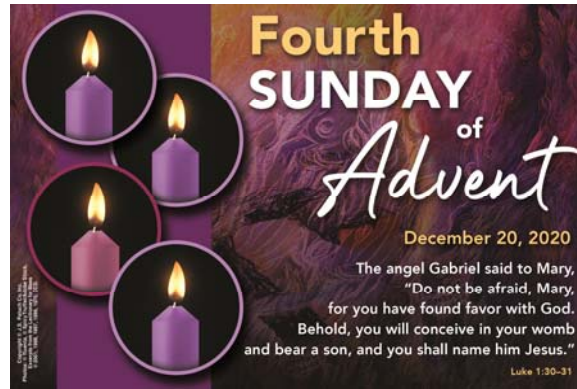

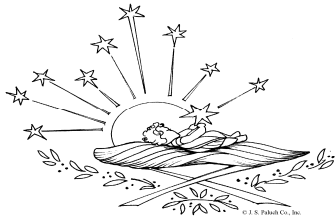

LOOKING AGAIN

Luke says that Mary "was greatly troubled at what was said and pondered what sort of greeting this might be." She asks, "How can this be?" These questions don't fit with how Fra Angelico positioned Gabriel and Mary. In the Vivas illustrations, the Angel Gabriel sits down with battered wings and a balding head and has a cup of coffee with Mary as the two of them try to figure it out together. The text is the same, but the message conveyed is different. There is a different degree of comfort and familiarity to these illustrations.

This "having a cup of coffee" is something we need to learn to do with the scriptures and with our lives. After this event, pregnant Mary traveled into the hill country to be with Elizabeth; an older, wiser, mentor—a mother figure. She spent three months there reflecting and preparing for the birth of her child. In this final week of Advent, take a few moments to find a Gabriel/Mary or an Elizabeth/Mary moment and read the Christmas readings again to see what you might have overlooked, and to find a new way for Christ to dwell in you.

CALIFORNIA BISHOPS ISSUE POSITIVE STATEMENT ON VACCINES

On December 3rd, the Catholic Bishops of California issued a statement and launched a webpage saying that the imminent Pfizer and Moderna COVID-19 vaccines are morally acceptable. The bishops committed the California Catholic Conference to working with Catholic health care ministries and Catholic Charities to promote and encourage COVID-19 vaccinations in collaboration with state and local governments and other entities. Archbishop Cordileone said, "I join my brother bishops in welcoming the news that safe, effective vaccines against the COVID-19 virus will soon be available. Together, we bishops affirm that the imminent Pfizer and Moderna COVID-19 vaccines are morally acceptable, and we encourage everyone to receive the vaccine when it becomes available." "SISTER HOPE" MENTAL HEALTH CHATBOT

The Archdiocesan Mental Health Ministry is offering a new resource, "**Sister Hope**." Sister Hope is a "chatbot," an AI-driven (Artificial Intelligence) response to text messages around issues of mental health. Its secular version is already in use by millions. It responds to text messages from someone with anxiety or depression, and offers suggestions and positive feedback. There is now a "religious" version, which the Archdiocese will pilot for a year. We believe this is particularly timely given the additional stress and isolation imposed by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Sister Hope is accessible in both English & Spanish, and free to anyone in the Archdiocese. This is ideal for people who don't need a professional counselor, but might need some support. Responde a mensajes de texto de personas con ansiedad o depresión, y ofrece sugerencias y apoyo positivo. Ahora ya tenemos una versión 'religiosa' que la Arquidiócesis va a utilizar por un año. Nos parece que será de mucho beneficio en este tiempo difícil para las personas que están sufriendo de estrés y aislamiento por COVID-19.

Sister Hope estará disponible completamente gratis en dos idiomas, inglés y español. Es bien útil para los que no buscan consejo profesional, pero necesitan apoyo. The speaker is national anti-trafficking leader Susan Patterson, who estimates that human trafficking is on course to be larger than drug trafficking in the U.S. within two years.
