



YOUR SERVANT IS LISTENING

We hear of young Samuel today, dedicated to a life of service to God, under the guidance of Eli, a Temple priest. Twice, Samuel hears the call of God and says "Here I am" to Eli. At last Eli recognizes that it is God who is calling Samuel. When Samuel hears God a third time, Samuel does not say "Here I am," but "Speak, LORD, for your servant is listening." We can see a subtle shift as Samuel moves away from announcing his intention to serve and more clearly opens himself to God's voice. Samuel allows God to take the initiative, and attends first to God's intentions rather than his own.

Samuel's story helps us to remember that accepting God's call is not only about a new chapter in our personal story. Our acceptance is, more profoundly, a new moment in God's story. Even in our smallest "yes," God celebrates our partnership in God's great work. Through our openness and acceptance, God has new opportunities to bring all of us into loving unity with God.

EVENTS TO MARK THE NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER FOR PROTECTION OF THE UNBORN

January 22, 1973 was the day on which the Supreme Court decisions in Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton were delivered. Each year on this date, Catholics in the United States are asked to pray for the protection of innocent preborn life. The U.S. bishops have designated this as the "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children." The Archdiocese of San Francisco is responding to this call with the following events:

- Archbishop Offers Mass and Asks for Prayer thru **Archdiocese** — Archbishop Cordileone will offer the Mass at noon at St. Mary's Cathedral on January 22nd, in prayer for the legal protection of the unborn. The Mass will also be livestreamed. Archbishop Cordileone has written a letter asking the faithful to join him in prayer on this day and encouraging each parish to offer a Mass of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children. (Visitacion will offer a special mass on this day at 7:30 pm, followed by the Daily Rosary.)
- Free Webinar: The Future of the Prolife Movement — While there is much to celebrate in the pro-life movement, the future has many challenges. How should the pro-life movement face these challenges in 2021? Archbishop Cordileone has invited pro-life thought leaders to help us answer this question during a Zoom webinar on January 22nd at 1:30 pm. You are invited to join the discussion, with the founder and president of the Susan B. Anthony List, Marjorie Dannenfelser, ethicist and moral theologian Dr. Charles Camosy of Fordham University, and Brian Duggan, Executive Director of Human Life Action. Moderating the discussion will be J. A. Gray, a former editor at First Things and New Oxford Review. There will be presentations, a panel discussion, and a question-and-answer period. All are welcome to attend, and there is no cost. Pre-registration is required, here: https://bit.ly/3nhh5El.
